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Spring Clean Up

Spring is just around the corner - soon the bees will be buzzing and flowers will be blooming! Here are a few tips to help get you started on spring clean up in your yard.

- * Prune dead branches from trees. Wait to prune any living branches until the weather is warmer and the tree begins to grow.
- * Cut back any perennials in your garden before they start to grow. Cut the leaves and stalks back almost to ground level, but wait until they have started to grow before replanting or dividing them.
- * This is a good time to get your garden tools ready for the season, clean any dirt from shovels and hoes, then use a file to sharpen them so they'll be easier to work with.
- * Clean dirt from loppers and shears, then put a few drops of oil on blades and hinges. Have the blades sharpened to make them easier to use.
- * Spread some slow-release fertilizer on your lawn, now, while it's still cold-so once the weather starts to warm, your lawn will get a good healthy start to the growing season.

Please remember to maintain your spruced up lawn so that we can all enjoy living in a beautiful neighborhood!

Many homes, including trim, fences, gates, porch railings etc. are showing signs of age and are also in need of cleaning, repair and painting.

Remember, to be in compliance with the Arbor Village CC&Rs, you must keep your home in good repair to maintain property values for all of us.

Important information

The Arbor Village HOA board is a group of volunteer homeowners elected by <u>you</u>, the homeowners, to enforce the Protective Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions to help protect property values for all homes within the Arbor Village Homeowners' Association. Compliance reviews are conducted monthly and courtesy letters are sent to homeowners who are in violation of the CC&Rs.

Non-compliance of the following are most often cited and may result in fines:

- Lawns should be regularly mowed and edged, weeds should be eliminated
- Trash containers must be stored out of sight by 10:00 pm on Wednesdays (trash collection day)
- Trash, junk, yard waste or other debris may not be stored in view of the street
- Inoperable vehicles may not be parked or stored on the property except inside a garage
- Trailers, recreational vehicles, and commercial trucks may not be stored or parked on the property
 overnight except by written permission of the board
- Fences should be repaired, replaced and/or painted as necessary
- Paint your home's exterior when existing paint is chipped or faded

Please do your part to comply with the CC&Rs and help keep our neighborhood looking nice and a place where we can all be proud to live.
