Exterior Home Maintenance Standards

The Architectural Control Committee (ACC) under the direction of the Board has developed a standard for exterior home maintenance within Arbor Village. This standard sets expectations for exterior home maintenance which is required without exception throughout the community and will be upheld to preserve property values and to ensure that Arbor Village remains an attractive place in which to live.

The standard addresses the guidelines for compliance pertaining to:

- Fence and gate maintenance and repair
- Painting of home exterior and trim
- Moss treatment

All Homeowners will receive a copy of the Exterior Home Maintenance Standards along with their annual Association Membership Meeting notification and packet.

Compliance to this standard will help to ensure an attractive neighborhood appearance. We appreciate your efforts to maintain your home and reflect pride of ownership in your property.

Or you can mail or deliver the form to Lynn at the WPM office. Each ACC request will be reviewed and processed as quickly as possible so you can get started on your projects. Remember, to be in compliance with the Arbor Village CC&Rs, you must keep your home in good repair to maintain property values for all of us.

Falling leaves clog gutters and drains

People aren't the only ones stressed by nasty weather. Trees react to weather, too, and when they do they shed their leaves. That annual botanical event frequently coincides with one of Western Washington's big fall storms – instantly clogging gutters and storm drains and bringing localized flooding.

Although utility crews work hard to clear street drains and culverts, there are thousands of drainage structures in the region. A big fall storm can bring more work than crews can handle. When neighbors pitch in and clear a clogged storm drain, they are helping to protect their neighborhood from flooding.

Take a moment to clean the storm drain grates in your neighborhood. Make sure they are free of leaves, litter, and other debris, particularly when rainy weather is headed your way. Clean up fallen leaves, twigs, grass cuttings and other debris from your yard and place it in the lawn waste container for pickup so it doesn't end up clogging the drain.



Mail Box Arbors Removed

You may have noticed that the wooden arbor structures covering the mailbox stations are missing. After the most recent inspection of the structures, the HOA board determined that significant wood rot and damage made them unstable and posed a safety hazard so they were removed. Replacing the arbors would require an additional assessment to all homeowners to cover the expense so it was decided not to rebuild them.
